The Antioch Initiative was formed by BILD International to plant churches and accelerate church-planting movements in North America. At the heart of the Antioch Initiative is the 30-City Urban Strategy, which will initiate and facilitate churches and church leaders networking together to plant churches in their urban centers. The network also consists of churches and leaders worldwide who desire to associate with the Antioch Initiative.

The CityChurch Network

The CityChurch Network will be a network of CityChurch networks across North America. These CityChurches will serve as their own church-planting movements and as "paradigm" models for those desiring to plant/network churches in the complex network of urban churches facilitated by the Antioch Initiative.

The Antioch School is developing partnerships with several organizations to build training experiences and coaching systems into high-powered ministry practicums to accelerate the leadership of these emerging Christian leaders.



“Known for its natural beauty and once ranked as one of the top places in the country to raise a family, Central Arkansas now faces many challenges. In a recent study by the Gallup organization on “community flourishing” Central Arkansas is ranked in the lowest two quintiles across all six of the areas measured. The 2008 UALR research report “Competitive Realities,” (we need to provide citations in the report) identified K-12 Education, Racial Unity, and Public Safety as major issues facing our community. Strong churches offer a source of true hope in facing these challenges and strong churches require well-prepared and courageous leaders.

The vision of the *Central Arkansas Antioch Initiative* is a church-based partnership for seeking the welfare of our city through an expanding Gospel movement. The initiative seeks the welfare of our city by:

- ✦ Strengthening church leadership through ordered and intentional Biblical training;
- ✦ Drawing resources into urban communities of need;
- ✦ Creating opportunity for local and affordable Bachelors, Masters and Doctorate degree programs.

The Central Arkansas Antioch Initiative dream for the coming decade includes:

- ✦ Witnessing hundreds of Central Arkansas churches with senior leaders ready and willing to power a gospel movement in their churches, in their communities and in the marketplace;
- ✦ Witnessing thousands of grass-roots leaders inspired and equipped to transform urban communities through gospel-centered ministry and marketplace leadership;
- ✦ Witnessing a naturally-occurring movement in Central Arkansas that engages churches into actions that lead to flourishing communities.

CENTRAL ARKANSAS ANTIOCH INITIATIVE GOALS:

North America may be in more need of strong, mature and thriving churches than ever before. Two keys to filling this need is establishing believers in their faith through intentional and ordered theological training and growing strong church leaders at all levels.

BUILD INSTITUTE – LEADERSHIP MASTERY SERIES I – III – Church-based leadership development system providing training resources for everything from establishing believers in their faith through Certificate and Diploma programs for deacons, elders and other senior church leaders.

ANTIOCH SCHOOL OF CHURCH PLANTING AND LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT – Bachelor, Master and Doctorate degree programs in Ministry or Theology. Local, church based, affordable, accredited and designed for a context of ongoing ministry.

URBAN CENTER DEGREE PROGRAMS – MINISTRY PRACTICUM TRACKS – Six different degree practicum tracks partnered with the Antioch School Bachelor degree program. Enables individuals to stay in their current life setting, be trained for ministry, develop marketable skills for high-impact work and ministry, and earn accredited degrees.

The previously referenced Gallup Organization quantifies the “General Wellbeing” of communities on a scale that spans **Thriving, Struggling or Suffering**. The CAAI can help unify the efforts of individuals and families, along with societal and faith community structures, to provide answers for life rebuilding:

LIFE SKILLS DEVELOPMENT – Goal: Equip individuals with the knowledge and wisdom to make sound life choices. Create opportunities for individuals to see sound family-life principles in action and engage in meaningful dialog on a regular basis.

FAITH DEVELOPMENT – Goal: help each individual learn the first principles of the faith and develop a biblical view of the world. Integrate individuals into the family life of believers where they can engage in learning designed to help them grow in their faith – from first steps to maturity.

EDUCATION AND LIFEWORK DEVELOPMENT – Goal: help each individual emerge with the education and work skills necessary to earn a living. Individuals receive assistance from mentors, education / career guidance, and support in developing work skills and experience.



BACKDROP

The Antioch School in Central Arkansas is made up of a network of churches who work together to host and administer a leadership development curriculum and formal degree plans. These programs are formalized through a partnership with the **Biblical Institute for Leadership Development** and the **Antioch School for Church Planting and Leadership Development**.




The learning process is accomplished through local, church-based study groups called “cohorts.” These groups use a repeating process of individual preparation, Socratic discussion, learning integration and

Competency mastery is evaluated by certified senior leaders at a local and a university level. Teaching practicums solidify mastery while providing the leadership for a multiplication of new “cohorts.”

CENTRAL ARKANSAS CHURCHES SEEKING THE WELFARE OF THE CITY

The Nehemiah Network, along with a handful of partnering “resource churches”, are becoming the catalyzing hub or backbone organization for the Central Arkansas Antioch Initiative.



This collaborative group seeks to UNITE churches and communities to tackle Central Arkansas issues in ways only a church network can.

As a starting point, the Nehemiah Network is building capacity to support a small staff (leadership and administration) to serve on behalf of the entire Core Resourcing Network.


This team motivates and supports the broader network, takes care of academic administration for the Central Arkansas Antioch School and champions overall communication for the Antioch Initiative.
